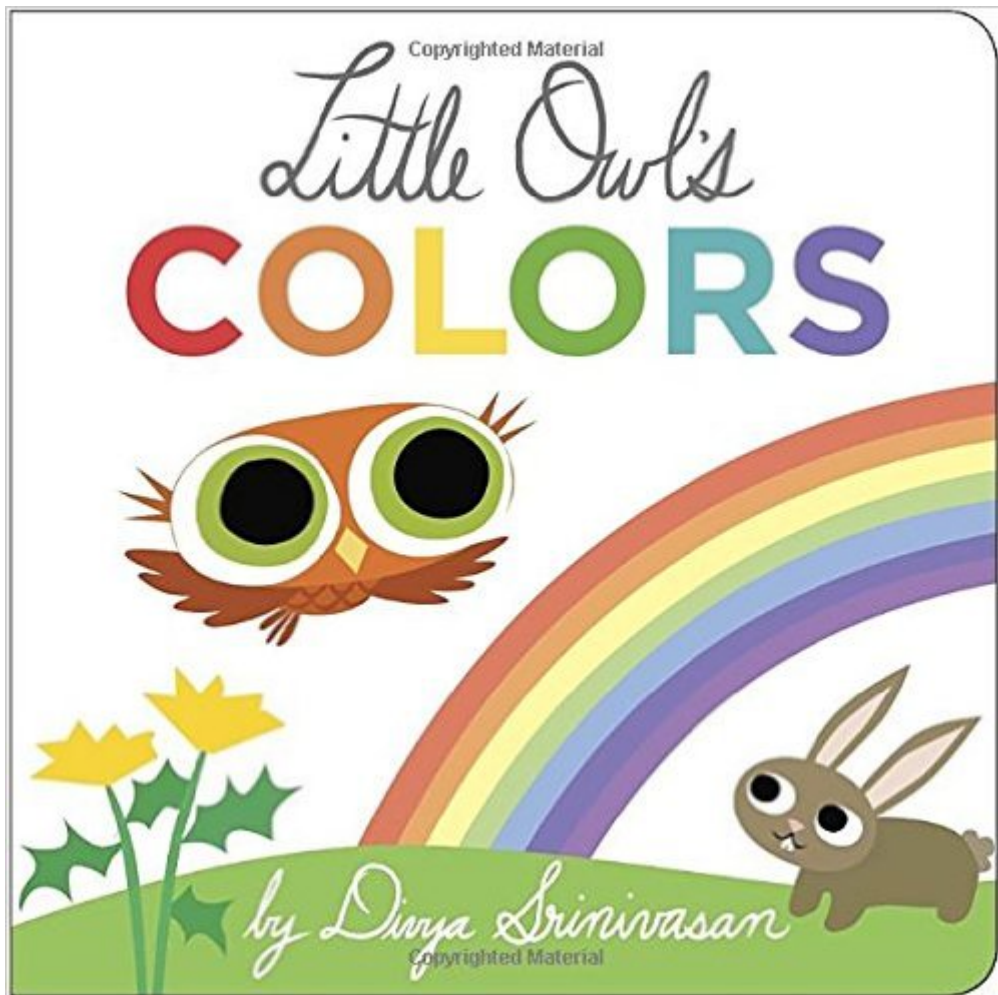

My 2 1/2 year old twins LOVE Little Owl's Night and we often read it for one of our bedtime stories. When I saw that Little Owl's Colors was coming out, I knew we had to get it for our collection. If you are familiar with Little Owl, you know that in Little Owl's Night he flies through the sky looking at the moon and stars and the animals that are out at night. In Little Owl's Colors some of those same animals appear as well as some others to show the different colors. Each page has one or two sentences that follow the same soft and smooth singsong style as Little Owl's Night, making it another excellent bedtime book. The pages are made of thick board book material which should withstand the toddler years. Even though my kids have other books about colors, I had to get this one because of how much they love Little Owl. If you are familiar with Little Owl and enjoy the stories, I would recommend Little Owl's Colors to anyone who is looking for a good book about learning colors. My kids were so excited when we received it that we had to read it right away! I highly recommend this book!

My 2 year old loves Little Owl's Night, so we had to get her Little Owl's Colors & 123; she loves seeing the animals reappear in all the books. The artwork is cute and with just a sentence or two per page, it keeps her attention and is a fun way to review her colors with her. Each page has the color, bold and in capital letters, written on the corner of the page, in the correspondingly colored ink (except black, which is written in white because it's on a black page). I was a little disappointed they left out the color pink, which could have easily been included as flowers on the page with purple. This book also introduced a few new animals that weren't in the other two books we have (Little Owl's Night & 123) - dragonflies, a bunny, butterflies, bees, and a cardinal; and my daughter was happy they finally named the badger, after he appeared in both her other books in the artwork but wasn't directly mentioned in the text!

This is perfect for reviewing colors with a toddler who is just starting to identify them. I like that "white" and "black" are covered on facing pages so that kids can see the contrast. The book is a great size - bigger and feels more substantial than many board books, but still easy for my two-year-old to hold. As soon as I finish reading a book to my daughter, she wants me to read it "again! again!" This is a book I don't mind reading a few times in a row.

This book is adorable. It's not too intense, but not too basic. It's not just the word purple, it's talking about the purple butterfly in the forest. Not too long, nor too short. Absolutely recommended.

My son loves "Little Owls Night" so this one was a no-brainer. As expected, it's cute and colorful while being very sturdy and simply written. I really like the animals/nature color comparisons as it makes it easy to point out similar things while out and about.

My son loved the "Little Owls Night" by the same author and when I saw this one, I knew I had to get it. Not the best for teaching colors but it does help reinforce the teaching and my son LOVES this book and to point out all the different animals. Truly beautiful illustrations. Enjoyable for kids and adults.

Bright and vivid illustrations. My daughter is four years old and loves owls. The Little Owl books have become her favorite. I purchased this book along with two others. Little Owls Night and Little Owls 1-2-3. She loves them all. The stories are simple without being immature in the language. Simple enough for older toddlers to help read along.
