

One nice thing about the book as it did have some great photography. I especially enjoyed the Gretzky 801st career goal scored on Arturs Irbe (Irbe was my favorite). I remember watching that game and it was a nice to see that again. There's a pretty sad looking picture of Derek Boogaard on the page before that. I needed something to smile

at after that.Overall, this is a decent book for a young kid (4-6) who knows very little about hockey. Many of the photographs are nice and there are some interesting things a kid might enjoy to know (like frozen pucks). Not much for young hockey fans... but good for kids who might not know much about the game. I'll give it 3 stars.

Not only was the book short, but it had facts that everyone knows. One being that if a player hits another player, it's considered a penalty.
