

This book was perfect in helping to teach my students about the state of New Mexico. They enjoyed reading the book and it was more interesting than only using our text book.

While this is a beautiful book, if you are buying this for your first grader, please keep in mind that you will have to read it to them. This book is listed for ages 6-8 and for grades 1-3 but in actuality, it is written at a much higher reading level. According to arbookfinder.com this book is a 6th grade reading level book and quite unsuitable for independent reading for a first grader.

This series of books is great. I live in NM and grew up in PA. The books are interesting for all ages, I use them in teaching pre-service elementary education teachers at the local university.

Though it's geared for children, any adult from NM will love this book. It is truly enchanting and will touch your heart as you turn the pages. It is on my list of favorite books.
